1912 Time Capsule Discovered A time capsule containing important remnants of early 20th century Texas A&M University history was discovered by workers renovating the YMCA building on campus. The capsule contained a 1911-1912 Annual Catalogue, a 1912 student handbook, an article on the groundbreaking of the YMCA building from The Battalion, pieces of a document that lists YMCA officers and YMCA bylaws, and a list of the class of 1914.

The capsule is currently on display at the <u>Cushing</u> <u>Memorial Library and Archives</u>.

Important Dates and Times


May 31 (Tuesday)	First day of first term and 10- week semester classes.

Student & Campus Happenings

Aggie Sports! The No. 13 ranked Aggie Baseball Team Claims the Big 12 Title! Texas

A&M beat Missouri to win the Big 12 Championship. The Aggies shared the Big 12 regular season crown with Texas. This is the third overall and second straight tournament championship for the Aggies, who also won the 2010 Big 12 Championship. Texas A&M will make its school-record fifth-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances next weekend when the Aggies host the NCAA College Station Regional at Olsen Field.



The <u>Men's Golf: NCAA Championship</u> begins on May 31st in Stillwater, OK. The 2011 NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championships are scheduled for May 31-June 5 at Karsten Creek in Stillwater. The tournament features three rounds of stroke play, with the top eight teams advancing to match play to decide the national champion. The Aggies are the number 8 Seed in the tournament. They have won two national titles in the last three seasons.

For the first time in school history, the Texas A&M track and field program swept the Big 12 Outdoor Championship team titles. It's the first time a school has achieved the sweep at the outdoor conference meet since Texas in 2006! <u>Track & Field: NCAA</u> <u>Championships</u> are scheduled for June 8-11 in Des Moines, Iowa. The Texas A&M women are ranked No. 2 for the upcoming championships and the Aggie men are ranked No. 1! Live television coverage of the meet can be found on cable's CBS Sports Network on Friday, June 10 and on national network CBS, Saturday, June 11.
