#### Texas A&M Parents' Weekend 2012



Parents' Weekend is a long standing tradition at Texas A&M. It began in 1919, when membership in the Corps of Cadets was mandatory. Mothers who

worried about their sons formed the Aggie Mother's Club to help their sons get through the "fish" and underclassmen years. An open house program was started and held on Mother's Day, before graduation. In 1969, graduation was pushed up and the program was moved to April. Corps flower pinning, chapel services, military reviews, Parents of the Year receptions, campus tours and outfit award presentations have been part of the weekend since its beginning. New activities are continually being added to include a wider variety of students.

Some of these new activities include a traditions program, concerts, Bevo Burn Barbecue, Maroon and White Football Game, All University Awards, and 'Ol Army Yell Practice.

Parents' Weekend is a special time dedicated to Aggie parents and family, and gives Aggie students a chance to express their gratitude to those who have impacted their lives.

This year has lots of activities planned for the weekend so you will need to decide what you can fit into your weekend! The weekend begins on Friday, March 30<sup>th</sup> with a variety of events, two of the notable ones being the Aggie Moms' boutique and Aggie Ring Day.

The Aggie Moms' Boutique, also known as the Aggie Gift and Craft Fair, is presented by all of the Aggie Moms' Clubs. Duncan Dining Hall is filled with booths from each club showcasing the best in Aggie gifts. It is a 2-day event, running both Friday and Saturday. It is must see (and buy)!

Aggie Ring Day is one of the biggest days in an Aggie's life when they receive their beloved Aggie ring. It is one of Texas A&M's most sacred traditions. A student may receive a ring once they have earned 90 undergraduate cumulative hours with 45 being resident hours at TAMU. Ring Day will kick off with a yell practice (at the Alumni Center) at 1:45PM and then rings will be distributed starting at 2:00PM. For more information visit AggieNetwork.com/Ring.

The 1<sup>st</sup> day ends with the well-known and beloved Midnight Yell at Kyle Field. Texas A&M's new football coach, Kevin Sumlin, as well as the 2012-2013 Student Body President, John Claybrook, will address attendees before yell practice begins.
